

Las Vegas Skyline Worries FAA

The FAA is worried about the number of high rises in the Las Vegas valley. It says the number of tall buildings, along with cell and broadcast towers, affects the number of flights that can land and take off from McCarran Airport.

During a local seminar, FAA officials said no where else in the country is the number of tall buildings to the point where officials worry about safety.

"We have reached the level now that any further growth or spread means that aircraft are going to have to take a different route of flight. They are going to have to come in at more inefficient altitude or we are not going to be able to have as many aircraft coming in," said **Kevin Haggerty** with FAA Obstruction Evaluation Service.

The FAA says it will face serious problems if one more building is allowed to go up in the way of their flight plans.
